Research

Over 10 funded research projects. Most recent 2 are below:

River Bend Town Commons: To develop a Master Plan for the Town Commons Park Site that is visionary, forward looking and holistic. Citizen participation is a significant strategy in developing this community-oriented project. This project pays attention to the historical, physical and environmental characteristics and existing assets of the site and aims to accommodate the needs of town citizens regardless of age and socio-economical standing. Furthermore, the project strives to accommodate diverse land uses such as town administration, individual and group entertainment/recreation and education/demonstration. Funding: Town of River Bend in the amount of \$12,000. (2002-2004)

Pamlico County Government Offices Evaluation and Master Plan Studies: An action-research project that is conducted in three phases: First, an assessment of the needs of the county in terms of physical facilities in the near term through surveys of appropriate county administrators and staff. These needs are compared to norms found in comparable contexts. Second, an assessment of what the county possesses in terms of physical facilities at present through site visits, maps and aerial photographs, as well as surveys of appropriate county administrators and staff. Lastly, a report on how the county can proceed to reconcile its needs with its resources. Several alternative scenarios is the center of this report so that the county can begin hiring professionals who can develop these scenarios into realizable solutions to the problems and opportunities identified in the earlier two phases of the project. Funding: Office of Pamlico County Manager; in the amount of \$10,000. (2001-2003)
