Services Offered by the Academic Support Center (ASC)

Exploring Majors

- Advise undeclared students and students still exploring majors
- Administer the Strong Interest Inventory (questionnaire to help students with their search)

Advising

- Help students clarify their educational goals, develop study skills and connect to appropriate resources
- Advisors use various tools to assess students' study skills, such as the Learning and Study Strategies Inventory (LASSI)
- Students on academic probation are required to meet with an ASC Advisor

Academic Accommodations for Students with a Disability

- Provide academic accommodations for students with a physical, mental and/or learning disability
- To receive accommodations, apply at the ASC by the fifth week of classes

Study Skills Workshops

- Workshops are held regularly covering a wide range of topics including time management and motivation
- AUS Study Skills Certificate is awarded to students who attend eight different workshops

Peer Advisors

- Academically successful students of Sophomore standing or higher who are available to meet with students for advice on succeeding at AUS
- They share study skills, provide information about majors, link students to AUS resources, and help students discover opportunities to get involved in campus activities

Student Support Crew

- Students who were previously on academic probation and are now in good standing share their success stories and practical study tips with new students and students that are currently struggling academically
- Activities include one-on-one advising, university presentations and events, delivering study skills workshops and creating educational and inspirational videos and content

Events

- Organizes events tackling topics of student interest, such as Disability Awareness Day and ASC Guest Speaker Series
- Journeys event held each semester highlights the life and journey of prominent AUS professors and administrators
- "Learning to Learn" panel discussion event is held each semester, where SSC Members discuss their journey from academic struggle to success

ASC recognizes that sometimes students who were academically successful in high school struggle with the transition to university. Regardless of the reasons why a student may be struggling academically, ASC is here to help students improve their academic performance.
