The Role of the Middle East Institute within the Gulf Arab Region

The Office of International Exchange Programs is pleased to announce this year's Woodrow Wilson Visiting Fellow and former US Ambassador Wendy Chamberlin. In 2007 she became the first woman President of the Middle East Institute, a nonpartisan organization founded on promoting understanding between the US and the Middle East.

Ambassador Chamberlin will be at AUS from 16-20 October. Her public lecture "The Role of the Middle East Institute within the Gulf Arab Region" will be Monday 17 October from 4 to 5 pm, in the Main Building, Lecture Hall A. A reception will be held in the rotunda immediately following the lecture.

Study Abroad opportunities


