Exploring Majors

Advise undeclared students and those exploring different majors.

Administer the Strong Interest Inventory Questionnaire to help students explore their interest.

Advising

Help students clarify their educational goals, develop study skills and connect to appropriate resources. Advisors use various tools to assess students' study skills, such as the Learning and Study Strategies Inventory (LASSI).

Students on academic probation are part of the Academic Thrive Program and are required to meet with an ASC Advisor.

Academic Accommodations for Students with a Disability

Provide academic accommodations for students with a physical or mental condition. To receive accommodations, apply at the ASC by the fifth week of classes.

Student Success Workshops

Workshops are held regularly covering a wide range of student success topics. Students who attend a number of different workshops can earn student success certificates.

ASC Peer Mentors

ASC Peer Mentors are AUS students typically in their junior or senior year who use first-hand experience to advise fellow students. They can share strategies for success and connect students to AUS resources and opportunities.

Academic Services

Academic (Major) Advisors

Offer course registration advising and information about the academic majors. Contact your designated advisor for assistance.

Faculty Office Hours

Teaching Assistants (TAs)

Many TAs deliver recitations or labs and may also offer additional review sessions and weekly office hours. Ask your instructor/professor about TA availability and offerings.
