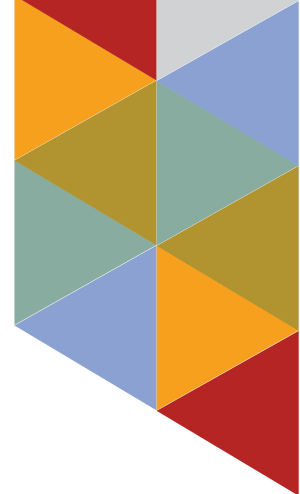

ASC Academic Coaching

Help students clarify their educational goals, develop study skills, and connect to appropriate resources. ASC Academic Coaches use various tools to assess students' study skills, such as the Learning and Study Strategies Inventory (LASSI). Students on academic probation are part of the Academic Thrive Program and are required to meet with an ASC Academic Coach.

Academic (Major) Advisors

Offer course registration advising and information about the academic majors. Contact your designated advisor for assistance.

Faculty Office Hours

Teaching Assistants (TAs)

Many TAs deliver recitations or labs and may also offer additional review sessions and weekly office hours. Ask your instructor/professor about TA availability and offerings.

BCE Learning Center (BCE)

Offers tutoring for Biology, Chemistry and Environmental Science courses (e.g. CHM 101, CHM 102, CHM 215, BIO 101, BIO 102, ENV 100 and others) to students registered in these courses. One-on-one and group tutoring sessions are offered on a booking basis.
