Deposit: AED 500 (this is due before you can be nominated to the host institution)

2. ISEP; Deadline: January 15, 2012

This application must be downloaded from: <http://bit.ly/OBaX5P> and uploaded to your online application portal at StudioAbroad. Application fee: AED 1,435 (\$390). Cost of meal plans for Outgoing ISEP students becomes AED7220 instead of AED9500!

Freie Universität Berlin International Summer and Winter University (FUBiS)

FUBiS is the official short-term summer and winter university of Freie Universität Berlin which is designed for international students. Every year, FUBiS welcomes about 650 students from over 60 countries, making it the largest multidisciplinary summer and winter university in Germany. Participants can choose between German language courses on up to five proficiency levels and subject courses in various disciplines, e. g. politics, literature and art history. Upon successful completion of the program, students earn ECTS credits and receive an official transcript of Freie Universität Berlin. AUS students now have the opportunity to study at the University of Evansville in the USA (Indiana) or at UE's British satellite campus, Harlaxton College. UE's program in Engineering is ABET accredited and offers coursework both in the USA and every fall semester in the United Kingdom. The UE Business program is AACSB accredited, also with coursework on the Evansville campus and in the UK. Programs of study on the Evansville campus include other pre-professional areas such as Education and Health Care and a wide range of coursework in the arts and sciences. Harlaxton College, one hour from London, is located in a magnificent English manor house and provides an intensive core course in British Studies, taught by our British professors, and elective courses in the arts, sciences, and pre-professional areas taught by visiting US professors. AUS professors may apply to teach for a semester on the visiting faculty of Harlaxton College. The Harlaxton Student Development Office organizes a full-range of activities including sports and recreation, weekend travel opportunities, and student organizations. Students and visiting faculty live on the grounds of the manor and take their meals in the College dining hall. Zuzana Simoniova Cmelikova Visiting International Scholar in Leadership and Ethics (2013-14)

The Jepson School of Leadership Studies is accepting applications for the position of Zuzana Simoniova Cmelikova Visiting International Scholar in Leadership and Ethics for 2013-14, a one-year visiting position. This program is designed to give visiting scholars who have extensive international experience the opportunity to develop courses, to design programs, or to conduct research on leadership ethics.

Visiting international scholars may be new Ph.D.'s or experienced scholars who hold a Ph.D. in an academic area related to the study of leadership and ethics. Scholars from newly formed democracies are encouraged to apply. Applicants should explain in a cover letter how their research, teaching, and future plans relate to the scholarship that they would pursue as a visitor at Jepson.

The Visiting International Scholar will be in residence at the University of Richmond for the academic year in order to pursue his or her own advanced research related to leadership and ethics. They will also give some presentations related to their research and/or issues related to leadership in their country. Successful applicants will receive a research stipend.

Review of applications will begin on **December 1** and continue until the position is filled.
