## **Tuition Exchange Scholarship**

Tuition exchange programs enable all **full-time AUS faculty and staff** to apply for the opportunity to send their dependents to study in the USA, and sometimes other countries as well, for a significant tuition discount and/or a total tuition waiver.

AUS maintains membership in two tuition exchange scholarship programs:

The **deadline** to apply for the CIC-TEP Program is **January 14, 2017**.

The Tuition Exchange (TE): http://www.tuitionexchange.org/

The **deadline** to apply for the TE Program is **November 19, 2016**.

For students applying to begin classes at a new university starting in Fall 2017 (or Spring 2018), AUS is able to nominate one student to apply for scholarships through the TE program, plus unlimited students to apply for scholarships through the CIC-TEP.

It is important to note that all interested students (i.e., faculty/staff dependents) must apply for admission directly to the institution they wish to attend, and that institution determines admission and admission procedures. Be aware that

the host university admissions process is completely separate from the process for awarding tuition exchange scholarships.

Also, please be aware that AUS can only nominate students for scholarships. Final award decisions are made by the host university.

## A Trip to India

Lucas Ballings, a Middle Eastern studies student from Leiden University, spent the Eid Al Adha holiday with friends in India. They visited Delhi, Agra and Jaipur.

Ballings said, "We chose this destination, because we wanted to experience an adventure in a totally different world to ours. We travelled for a total of five days and we did the Golden Triangle route. We visited many different places while we were there, like the famous buildings, palaces, etc. We also got to ride elephants and play with them, which was a really cool experience. However, from what I've noticed, the best way to explore India is to just walk around through the bazaars and the old city centers."

When asked about his experience, Ballings replied, "I was expecting to see beautiful buildings and architecture from the old empires, but also poverty and adverse circumstances. India's architecture was exactly what I expected it to be. However, I don't think it was possible for me to imagine what India was like without having been there before. I think visiting India will always be a culture shock for me; it is a totally different world and it is only three and a

half hours from Dubai by plane."

Ballings advised, "Travel as much as you can, and be an adventurer. Try to see other parts of the world. Dubai is an international flying hub that offers a lot of cheap flights all over the world, so try to take advantage of this opportunity. Also try to find other students to travel with you, so that the costs of the trip could be split and so that you can share experiences together. If I could sum up this entire experience into one sentence, I would say, India is a beautiful country full of contrast."
